

WORLD BOOK DAY and BOOK FAIR

We will be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 7th March. This special day promotes reading for personal benefit and enjoyment by encouraging children to explore the pleasure of books. In order to join in the fun, the children in the Primary School should come to school as an adjective or a 'describing word' of their choosing. For example, the word 'delicious' could be



represented by a homemade costume covered in food wrappers or even a costume of a hot dog! The word 'colourful' could be represented by bright clothes with rainbows or flowers attached. The more creative and inventive the better! We are delighted that we are hosting the Scholastic Book Fair the week beginning Monday 4th March. Children will be able to use their World Book Day token to get £1 off a book over the price of £2.99.

GRANDPARENTS' DAY

As you are aware, we are having a special Grandparents' Assembly on Friday 1st March. As a health promoting school, I would remind you that children should bring a healthy break to school. I would also remind you that we are a nut free school and children should not bring nut products to school. Due to being a health promoting school and in the interest of children with allergies, we are unable to give the children cakes or treats sent in by parents/guardians when it is their birthday. 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YOUR CHILD'S HEALTH

In this season of colds and flu, I would be grateful if you could remind your children to take extra care to wash their hands thoroughly, to cover their mouth when coughing and to use a tissue. I would also encourage you to regularly check your child's hair for headlice. If you find that your child has headlice or nits, please seek treatment from your pharmacy. I would also be grateful if you could let the class teacher know. Please note that having headlice or nits is not a reason for your child to be absent from school. ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

In order to continue to raise standards in our school, we are continually trying to improve punctuality and attendance. Class teachers are now responsible for recording your child's attendance on the school computer system, SIMS.

If your child is absent for any reason, a written note must be given to the class teacher to explain the absence. You may phone the office to inform us that your child will not be present but we would also ask for a written note to be sent in once your child returns to school. Teachers will be recording reasons for absences and, along with the Senior Leadership Team, will be monitoring children's attendance. Please note that children's poor attendance will be referred to the Education Welfare Officer.

It is also very important that all children are in class at 9.00am and this will also be monitored by the class teacher. Any child who is late three times in one month will receive a letter indicating that they have been late and reminding the parents/guardians of the importance of the child being in class at 9.00am. When a child is late for class, not only does it disrupt the class but the child can feel flustered and upset. Please try to ensure that your child is in class ready to begin their day at 9.00am. Please note that when a child is late for class it is recorded on their attendance record.

PEACE PROMS

We are delighted that, once again, we had two choirs performing in the Peace Proms—Our Year Five Shared Education choir with Whitehouse Primary School and our Year 6 and 7 choir. The children performed on Sunday 24th February in the SSE Arena in Belfast. This was a very exciting opportunity for the children and the staff and parents were very proud of them all.
